How to describe Nobuhiko Obayahshi's 1977 movie HOUSE? As a psychedelic ghost tale? A stream-of consciousness bedtime story? An episode of Scooby Doo as directed by Dario Argento? Any of the above wil do for this hallucinatory head-trip about a schoolgirl who travels with six classmates to her ailing aunt's creaky country home, only to come face to face with evil spirits, bloodthirsty pianos, and a demonic housecat. Too absurd to be genuinely terrifying, yet too nightmarish to be merely comic, HOUSE seems like t was beamed to Earth from anothe planet. Or perhaps the mind of a child:

the director fashioned the script after the eccentric musings of his elevenyear-old daughter, then employed all the tricks in his analog arsenal (mattes, animation, and collage) to make them a visually astonishing, raucous reality. Never before released in the United States, and a bona fide cult classic in the making, HOUSE is one of the most exciting genre discoveries in years.

Her BLUEBEARD is a middle-aged behemoth, easily four times the size of his child bride. The fairytale is acted out in a 16th century setting

and explicated, often hilariously, by a

With DADDY LONGLEGS, Josh and Benny Safdie have crafted a realistic fairy tale that captures the magic of parenthood, invoking memories of their inventive dad from their own childhood ... Divorced and alone, Lenny (the perfectly cast Ronald Bronstein) is the father of two young boys he gets to see a couple of weeks a year. He cherishes these days with the kids, being both stern parent and lovable buddy, inventing myths and somehow living them, all while working overtime in the big city. When the going gets tough, Lenny uses some unusual, perhaps even hazardous, techniques to keep the kids safe from the world.

Because of the film's fluid style, we feel that we are in the boxing ring alongside Lenny, as flawed as he is charismatic, champion of each day, yet totally black and blue. As the storm of society continually rains on him, Lenny laughs through it all. Isn't life crazy? – 2010 Sundance Film Festival

A victory for handmade animation, Wes Anderson's FANTASTIC MR. FOX shows it's flaws with pride and manages to be utterly charming and hilarious at the same time. Clooney's charm shines through with just his voice as Mr. Fox, a family man, and former rogue, who's trying to keep to the straight and narrow – but just can't resist the allure of 'one last job.'

Another stop-motion animation wonder from last year, the Belgian feature A TOWN CALLED PANIC is sort of like a Nickelodeon show on acid. With lead characters cast from simple plastic figurines, the film stars a Cowboy and Indian who are roommates (and sort of dysfunctional brothers) – their unlikely third roommate (and father 'figure') is, of course, Horse. Explaining the plot is essentially useless as the real joy of this film comes from discovering how these oddball characters interact with each other and their equally strange neighbor – an absurdly belligerent farmer. Extremely fun!

CITIZEN KANE

Fri at 7:15; Sat at 1:00, 5:30 (1941) dir Orson Welles w/ Welles, Joseph Cotten, Dorothy Comingore [119 min] Undoubtedly Orson Welles most well known film – and considered the best of all time by many - CITIZEN KANE is an undeniable classic. Amazingly, Welles' debut as a film director, KANE tells the story of Charles Foster Kane - the scion of a powerful family who rises as an egalitarian newspaperman and falls as an aspiring politician. Told through the eyes of those who knew him, the story bends back and forth through time creating a mosaic picture Double Feature!

MAGNIFICENT AMBERSONS

Fri at 5:15; Sat at 3:30, 8:00 (1942) dir Orson Welles w/Joseph Cotten, Dolores Costello, Anne Baxter [88 min] Welles' 1942 follow-up to CITIZEN KANE, THE MAGNIFICENT AMBER-SONS charts the downfall of a wealthy Indianapolis family. This film marks one of the greatest artistic betrayals of Welles's career: Upon completion of the film, creative control was seized from Welles and it was cut from 2 hours

to 88 minutes. Despite this injustice, AMBERSONS remains a "truncated

masterpiece", and an ideal showcase for Welles's bold direction.

LADY FROM SHANGHAI

(1947) dir Orson Welles w/Welles, Rita Hayworth, Everett Sloane [87 min] One of the most deliriously beautiful, prodigiously crazy films ever made. At once Welles' farewell to his estranged wife Rita Hayworth and a seriocomic exploration of the everyday viciousness of the rich and powerful, this remains one of his most consistently inventive films. The convoluted story, featuring an itinerant sailor (Welles at his most endearingly hammy) who falls for a radiant young woman of mystery (Hayworth) while falling in with her treacherous husband (Sloane) and his cohorts, allows Welles to create an inside-out world, leading to a spectacular shoot-out in a hall of mirrors. TOUCH OF EVIL

(1958) dir Orson Welles w/Charlton Heston, Janet Leigh, Welles [112 min] Welles was fired as director during post-production of this 1959 film noir classic. TOUCH OF EVIL was re-fashoned by the studio and shown as the

second half of a double bill featuring a film entitled The Female Animal. Before his death, Welles left instructions on how he wanted the film to be edited; this restored 1998 version reflects these changes. The film stars Janet Leigh and Charlton Heston as a couple who's Mexican honeymoon is disrupted by a sinister drug lord and features some of the most remarkably chiaroscuro images of the film noir period.

The New York Times* has dubbed its idio-syncratic director "a latter-day anti-genius to rival Edward D. Wood Jr." It's been raved about by comedians Patton Oswalt and Tim & Eric. And Entertainment Weekly says it their "new, crazy movie obsession." Brace yourselves, because BIRDEMIC is coming to Boston!

Writer/producer/director/software salesman James Nguyen has created an insanely bizarre homage to Alfred Hitchcock with BIRDEMIC – a "romantic thriller" that begins as a seemingly innocuous love story between an attractive (if wooden) couple. But, as Nguyen says, if you watch carefully there are hints that all is not right. Suddenly the action starts, the feathers start flying, and there is no stopping the avian carnage!

"It is perhaps redundant to call Harmony Korine's TRASH HUMPERS a provo cation. For starters, the title is meant literally. Korine's fourth feature... chronicles the exploits of several grotesque elderly cretins (played by, among others, Korine and his wife, Rachel, in wigs and creepy old-person masks). They are the nightmare embodiment of the dregs of society, hanging out unde bridges and in abandoned buildings. In the absence of traditional forms of entertainment, they make their own fun... And, as promised, they rub up against garbage cans for the sheer hell of it.

"Essentially [a] non-narrative collages of discrete scenes pitched somewhere between vaudeville and viral video... Shot on aggressively loft video, complete with vintage-analog glitches and distortions, TRASH HUMPERS is meant to suggest a found artifact – or more to the point, a battered VHS tape fished out of the garbage... [A] slice of Southern-gothic science fiction. Is it a lost underground movie or a new species of freak-folk art?" - Dennis Lim,

Astaire plays a dancer who is contracted by producer Horace Hardwick (the terminally and hilariously flustered Horton) to put on a new show. Demonstrating his footwork one night he annoys his downstairs neighbor, who happens to be an attractive young woman. Sparks fly and mistaken identities ensue as the plot thickens and the dancing intensifies. The marvelous Irving Berlin score features the classic "Cheek To Cheek" and Astaire's signature number "Top Hat, White Tie and Tails."

LA DOLCE VITA

(1960) dir Federico Fellini w/Marcello Mastroianni, Anouk Aimee, Anita Ekberg

In LA DOLCE VITA, Fellini's frequent collaborator Marcello Mastroianni plays a member of the paparazzi – back when that was a cool thing to be. Fellin fills his film with portentous symbols but never allows them to take away from the pleasure of watching Marcello track the highs and lows of the playboys and aristocrats of Rome – getting caught up in the lifestyle most of the time. Fellini's deft and gorgeous filmmaking brings the life of swinging Rome onto celluloid with exuberance and finesse, and then the music of Nina Rota (who composed most of Fellini's films) pulls it all together.

Double Feature! OCEAN'S 11

at 3:30, 9:30 (1960) dir Lewis Milestone w/Frank Sinatra, Dean Martin, Sammy Davis Jr, Peter Lawford, Joey Bishop, Angie Dickson [127 min]

Swinging at the other end of the spectrum from LA DOLCE VITA are Frank, Dean, Sammy and the rest of the Rat Pack. In the original OCEAN'S 11, the gang play a group of old war buddies who come together for an unbelievable heist that could set them up for life. Set in the neon-lit Las Vegas of the 1950s and mainly ad-libbed by this über-talented crew, OCEAN'S 11 is one of the single coolest heist movies ever made.

REVENGE OF THE GRINDHOUSE

Fri at 8:00; Also Screens Mon, June 14 at 5:30 (1969) dir Umberto Lenzi w/Carroll Baker [94 min]

Beautiful American star Carroll (Baby Doll) Baker stars in an unbelievably mean-spirited and elegant psychosexual thriller from Umberto Lenzi. This mean-spirited and elegant psychosexual thriller from Umberto Lenzi. This film is Euro-ambient to the extreme, with charmingly off-kilter framing, matter-of-fact kinkiness and one of master Piero Umiliani's best scores. Baker plays a wealthy young widow who retires to her late husband's Italian villa for a relaxing holiday of Scotch and self-loathing. When she meets a magnetic young drifter he involves her in a cat-and-mouse game of sado-masochistic psychological manipulation that sends her spiraling into delirium. When the drifter's sister shows up things get even more complicated and, uh, erotic. Carroll Baker gives an amazing performance, at one point she delivers an unforgettable monologue that begins, "When I think of



BLACK COBRA

at 10:00pm (1976) dir Joe D'Amato w/Laura Gemser [90 min] Every night before I lie down to sleep, I say my prayers. I thank God for the birds and the flowers and the morning dew and puppy dogs... But mostly I thank God – at length – for Laura Gemser, star of BLACK COBRA. Miss Gemser was positively heaven-sent for the sex-film explosion of the '70s: lithe, dark-skinned, with doe-eyes and movements as graceful as a lily in the breeze. She may well have been the most beautiful actress of the '70s - period. But her career track led her to star in some of the most perverse films ever made. Her Black Emanuelle knockoff movies more than made up for in kink what they lacked in glossy production values. The director she collaborated with most fruitfully was Joe D'Amato, a filmmaker of sporadic brilliance whose talent really came to life with the addition of Gemser. BLACK COBRA is one of their best collaborations, and my personal favorite. Gemser plays a stripper with a python act who has a very strange effect on two brothers - sleazy charmer (and her real life husband) Gabriele Tinti and the late, great Jack Palance, as a bizarre, ranting snake fetishist. With an ending that will leave you speechless. Music by Piero Umiliani.

CHAINED HEAT

[1983] dir Paul Nicolas w/Linda Blair, Sybil Danning, John Vernon, Tame Dobson, Stella Stevens [95 min]

CHAINED HEAT is pure women-in-prison exploitation with all the catfights, steamy shower scenes and deviant sexuality you can handle. Maybe more! Linda Blair plays the new fish on the cellblock. With Queen of the Amazons Sybil Danning and Cleopatra Jones star Tamara Dobson as warring inmates. Kinky Stella Stevens cracks the whip as the captain of the guards and scuzzy John Vernon plays the warden (who has a hot tub in his office). Sharp-eyed viewers will also recognize the great Henry Silva. Others may disagree but I think this is a great first-date movie (but be sure to bring enough for her cab fare home just in case). Either she'll love it or she'll flee What better way to separate the wheat from the chaff? After all, who wants to get stuck with a good girl?

VELVET VAMPIRE

at 8:00pm (1971) dir Stephanie Rothaman w/Celeste Yarnall [80 min] Trailblazing writer/director Stephanie Rothman has provided some of the orable exploitation movies ever: The Student Nurses, Termina Island, Group Marriage, The Working Girls, etc. This is possibly her weirdest – a one-of-a-kind aquarian sex-vampire epic. Though made in America, the film incorporates a lot of the techniques we associate with artsy European horror movies - an emphasis on storytelling through color, slow psychedelic dissolves, and that old standby: abundant nudity. Celeste Yarnall as the bloodsucker of the title provides a clear sexual focus for this movie about a vapid bleached blonde California couple who find themselves ensnared in a vampire's desert lair. Better than you'd expect, and possibly the only vampire movie to successfully incorporate dune buggies

bluesman Johnny Shines, who performs "Evil Hearted Woman

Screw those mama's boys. I love Jean Rollin's movies so much I would go to WAR for them if I had to. For years I've gotten weird looks everytime I rave about Rollin's pulp art masterpieces like *The Nude Vampire*, Caged Virgins, Schoolgirl Hitchhikers and this one. Rollin's films are virtual encyclopedias of fetishistic sex and horror movie imagery, lashed together under the flimsiest dime novel pretexts of plot. But they garnered an enthusiastic following among students in Paris, who watched these bizarre films alongside the skid row popeyes in Pigalle nudie theaters. THRILL OF THE VAMPIRES features the gorgeous French sex star Sandra Julian (I Am A Nymphomaniac) as a beautiful vampire who sleeps in a grandfather clock. Music by teenage prog rock band

Acanthus. Insanely rare and essential.

LADY TERMINATOR

Sat at midnight; Also screens Thu, June 17 at 9:30 (1988) dir Jalil Jackson w/Barbara Ann Constable [82 min] Get ready for your face to melt completely off your skull. A vapid anthropology student (Barbara Ann Constable, also credited with make-up) is drawn undersea and infected with the centuries-old Curse Of The South Sea Queen by a magic glowing sea snake that takes up residence in her vagina. When she emerges from the ocean she acts exactly like Arnold Schwarzenegger in *The Terminator* as she pursues a young singer who happens to be the great granddaughter of the South Sea Queen's nemesis. In search of her prey, the Lady Terminator goes on a hyperbolic killing spree in Jakarta, tak-ing special care to annihilate the genitals of every man she comes into conwith, either with a machine-gun or her sharp-toothed cooch-snake. This Indonesian brain smasher is really something special. The dialogue is top-shelf, the basement-level special effects are sublime, it's more violent than

the last seven world wars put together - in its own inimitable way this is one of the classics of all time. Don't even dream about missing this.

I've never had kids and I never will. I've watched enough movies to know they're bad news. Even if they aren't possessed by the devil, they still learn to hate you and all you stand for - even as they eat all your food and wreck your sex life! If I ever waver in my determination to remain child-free, I'll just thread this movie up. An otherwise unknown actress named Isabelle Mejias gives a performance to remember as a daughter with a serious daddy hang up. There's not a huge volume of physical violence in the film but the spriritual violence wrought by the cunning and manipulative teenager is hellishly intense. Starring Anthony Franciosa as the lucky dad and Teutonic Amazon Sybil Danning as the girl's unfortunate new step-mom. It's only appropriate to warn you that the wrong-meter goes into the red here several times, which is just where I like it!

EMMA MAE

Sun at 9:45pm; Also screens Wed, June 16 at 7:15 (1976) dir Jamaa Fanaka w/Jerri Hayes [100 min]

From the great Jamaa Fanaka, director of *Penitentiary* and *Welcome Home Brother Charles*, comes this underheralded blaxploitation classic. Emma Mae (played by the fiery Jerri Hayes), straight off the farm, comes to live with her aunt and uncle in the projects of South Central LA when her mother dies. At first Emma Mae, with her Southern drawl, unfashionable Sunday clothes and country ways, seems totally unequipped to deal with the big bad ghetto, but pretty soon she's at the top of the heap, mainly due to the fact that she can kick more ass than a donkey. It's not typical blaxploitation so if you're looking for an excuse to dress like a pimp and drink Colt .45, you may be disappointed. But if you love black culture of the 170s, get ready to have a new favorite movie. Fanaka really takes the time to create fleshed out, memorable characters - and he lets them talk, hilariously and engaging ly. So that when the time comes for Emma Mae to settle the score you'll find vourself standing up in your seat cheering her on.

MR. SCARFACE

Mon at 7:30pm; Also screens Thu, June 17 at 5:30 (1976) dir Fernando Di Leo w/Harry Baer, Al Cliver, Jack Palance, Vittorio Caprio

Casual brutality alternates with vulgar comedy in one of the most entertain ing Italian crime movies ever made, as should be expected from Fernando Di Leo, the grand master of the form. Jack Palance plays a bad, bad man who runs a neighborhood crime syndicate in Rome. But when a series of small outrages escalates to an all-out war he proves no match for a couple of slacker kids (Harry Baer and Al Cliver) with a dune buggy and an overthe-hill consigliere (the great Vittorio Caprioli) who still remembers the old days and the old ways. While not a comedy as such, this film contains more laugh out loud scenes than all but the very best comedies. But it also delivers shocking, intense violence and a pungent ambience redolent of sleazy pool halls and greasy hair tonic. I can't recommend this movie highly

enough. This is pulp art at its very best.

Double Feature!

LOADED GUNS (1975) dir Fernando Di Leo w/Ursula Andress, Woody Strode [90 min] A Stewardessploitation Classic! The late Fernando Di Leo made some of the toughest, funniest crime movies ever. He was the master of ultraviolent comedy. Usually his films feature a tough hombre who gets caught up in a struggle between two mafia factions and gets over on the mobsters using super or intelligence and nerves of steel. Along the way, Di Leo creates brutal and hilarious poetry among the bloodshed. LOADED GUNS is different in tone and content from his other movies like MISTER SCARFACE and The Italian Connection. Ursula Andress, of all people, is the heroine, a stewardess who's had just about enough crap from everybody... you included. When a message she delivers gets her into hot water, she takes on corrupt circus ringleader Woody Strode and his tough bunch of carnival workers with the help of her handsome acrobat boyfriend. The movie is played as a broad farce and it's a crazy love story to boot. Everyone in the movie is having a great time and there's a contagious feeling of mischief and conspiracy between film maker and audience. The climax of the movie is a huge brawl

in which Di Leo's entire stock company of hoods tear down the whole car

Tuesday, June 15 TEEN LUST

at 7:30pm (1979) dir James Hong w/Kristen Baker [89 min]

This outrageous farce, directed (and possibly written) by longtime character actor James Hong (Chinatown, Big Trouble In Little China), is like a wholly American distillation of late-period Luis Bunuel. Good taste is roughly elbowed aside and black-humored perversity reigns inside as we are introduced to lovely young Carol (Kristen Baker), a police academy cadet who has family problems. Her gross father is always on the make for her, her mother drinks like a sailor on a three-day shore leave, and her model-airplane obsessed retarded brother wants to marry her. Fortunately she has her police work – which largely consists of dressing like a hooker and being groped by perps, that is when she's not being groped by the other cops. Her problems aren't confined to home and work though, even when she tries to spend a little quiet time with her hot-rodding boyfriend, she's dragged from the car by a gang of amorous 8 year olds (while the theme from The People's Court blasts on the soundtrack). When she seeks religious counsel, the family priest tells her he's gay, and that "all Hitler needed was a hug", which only serves to confuse her. But the confusion is just beginning as things really get strange. When are they going to put this s*** in the Library Of Congress?




